Priorities for 24/25

- Shacklewell has a newly revised curriculum handbook to be used across the federation this means everything is in place for teachers at the start of the next academic year.
- Carrying on from the Identity project, it was identified that there is a huge value in whole school projects.
 From next term, every Friday afternoon there will be cross year activities built into the timetable working on new project "Here to be Heard"
- It was acknowledged and appreciated by the parents, that the staff worked incredibly hard to make the Identity project happen. The feedback was very positive, except from Year 3 and Year 4 parents who had last minute time changes and some children's art work was not available to see on the day. Overall families thoroughly enjoyed being invited into school to see what the children have been working on.

Staffing 24/25

- The Parent Council is aware of a number of members of staff leaving Shacklewell this year. Families value their relationships with the teachers and wondered if the office could be quicker at informing families as to the plans for next year. Rory noted that he would not be able to inform families about leavers, until a secure plan is in place. He confirmed that Ms. Williams and Mr. Middleburg will both be returning to take up the deputy headteacher roles and assistant headteacher roles
- It was discussed that teachers leaving is down to a few factors, including relocation, promotions, lifestyle changes. The PC raised the concern that the pressure put on the teachers to maintain the incredibly high standards required of them could put teachers off working at Shacklewell. Rory rightly pointed out that the standards indeed are high and he would like to keep them that way.
- The Parent Council wishes to pass on their thanks to the staff and teachers for all they do for the children.

2. Shacklewell Families

The Governing board of the Federation wanted to send a special well done to Gilly, Elina and Su for all their amazing fundraising efforts again this year. It was noted again that they need more help organising events as this might hinder the number of fund raising activities next year if they don't get more people onboard.

3. Year 6 Updates

Some year 6 families were concerned that their children weren't having enough fun extra curricular activities after their SATS. The school listened to their concerns and added in 3 additional visits/experiences before the end of the year.

4. MCAS
